## 2021 Federal Election – Threat Trend: **STABLE**

### Threat Updates

#### GAC/RRM

- (U//OUO) RRM Canada did not observe any significant indicators of foreign state-sponsored information manipulation in its monitoring of the broader Canadian digital information ecosystem during the period of September 17 to 19.
- (U//OUO) Chinese Communist Party media outlets have not published further stories about GE44. Canadian WeChat news accounts have not published further editorials urging Canadians of Chinese heritage to vote for a specific candidate or party.
- (U//OUO) Russian state-media outlet RT published a podcast hosted by George Galloway that discussed GE44 with strong anti-LPC sentiments. Galloway and an RT journalist claimed Canada has changed from a “popular, gentle country” to one that is “playing a controversial role in the world,” citing Canada’s role in Afghanistan and mass graves at Canadian residential schools. Galloway is one of RT’s most popular hosts on social media; however, he has not shared this episode of his podcast on his social media feeds, and it is not clear what level of engagement it is receiving.

#### RCMP

(U) *Information current as of 19 September 2021, 1500hrs*

- (PB) Threats directed towards Protected Persons continue, with the Prime Minister (PM) remaining the primary target.
- (PB) On 17 September, 2021, posts on Twitter, TikTok, and Instagram were reported for containing violent comments and indirect threats toward the PM.
- (PB) On 16 September, 2021, an individual called the Library of Parliament and made several threats towards the PM and other Members of Parliament and threatened to attack Parliament. The individual also spoke of conspiracy theories.
- (PB) RCMP currently does not possess any information that suggests individuals are overtly advocating for violence on election day. However, a post was made to a Canadian pro-gun Facebook page on 19 September with the title “Election day scene”, which included a meme of what appears to be a female in costume carrying a gun with the caption, “Heading to the polls with a firearm - because I do”. It is likely that polling stations throughout Canada will experience
