2023 Federal By-Elections

Threat Updates

GAC

- (U) RRM Canada did not observe any significant indicators of foreign state-sponsored information manipulation in its monitoring of the broader Canadian digital information ecosystem from June 18 to 20.
- (U) RRM Canada assesses the vast majority of content originated from recognizable Canadian news sites, and found no foreign state-sponsored news outlets commenting on the by-election.
- (U) On voting day, both French- and English-language news outlets in Canada took stock of the results, and provided some colour commentary:
 - Due to the recent publishing date of vote result articles, RRM Canada was not able to receive a full
 picture of user engagement with the topic. Based on a preliminary assessment, there are no
 outward signs that a foreign entity attempted to artificially decrease or increase Canadian user
 engagement with news about the June 19 by-election results.
 - Overall, user engagement with by-election topics remained low on both the eve of voting day, and voting day. User engagement with French-language articles hovered between 10 to 115 unique user interactions – including "likes," "comments", and "shares" – while user engagement with Englishlanguage articles ranged between 75 and 1K unique user interactions.
- (U) For the June 18-20 reporting period, RRM Canada did not surface any Chinese-language news articles
 about the vote result.
