Deputies,

At the request of the Sergeant-at-Arms of the House of Commons, Public Safety/ONCFIC and its partners (CSIS, RCMP and CSE/CSSS) have produced and delivered an unclassified briefing on foreign interference (FI) to all available federal Members of Parliament.

The 25 minute briefing provided foundational knowledge on the threat of FI, explained why MPs and their staff would be key targets, and advised on protecting their social and digital lives. The briefings were followed by 15 to 30min Q&A sessions.

On the SAA's advice, we have delivered these separate sessions to party caucuses. We delivered a total of seven sessions from June 12 to 20 (LPC, NDP, BQ, CPC, Green, independents) in person, on the Hill.

The briefings were well received and generated animated Q&A sessions. We have received very positive feedback from the SAA and parties.

This round of briefings is considered complete. The SAA may come back to me with further requests in the future.
