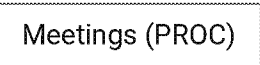
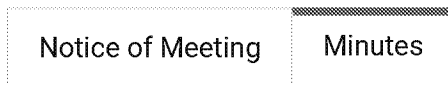
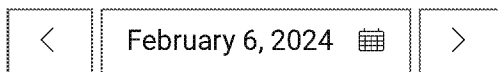


PROC COMMITTEE MEETING

That, in relation to its study of the international embarrassment which followed the attendance and recognition of a former soldier of a Nazi military unit at the President of Ukraine's 2023 address to Parliament, the committee:
